Covid-19 Update Alert Level 2

Following the Prime Minister's announcement, we were excited and relieved to learn of the conditions under which schools can re-open fully under Alert Level 2. Firstly, we are extremely mindful that this is not "business as usual"; staff and students are not returning from the equivalent of a Christmas holiday break. The experiences of lockdown, online learning and the economic impact on whanau have been markedly different for each of us. It would be wrong to expect that learning will simply pick up where we left off in March. There will be an adjustment period as we get classroom learning back up to speed. Our focus will be on reestablishing teaching relationships. routines and support student wellbeing.

Ministry of Health statement for education

The two key public health principles that support our approach at Alert Level 2 are first to minimise the risk that someone gets infected in the first place, and second to ensure we can identify and contact anyone who has been in close contact with a person, if someone in a college is infected.

Any students or staff should stay at home if they are sick or will be sent home immediately if they show any symptoms. If a student is sent home, it is our expectation that they are tested and receive a negative result for Covid-19 before returning to College.

Physical distancing is a good precaution to prevent the spread of disease. In an Alert level 2 school environment, this means students and staff maintaining a physical distance so that they are not breathing on or touching each other, coupled with good hygiene practices (coughing into your elbow, handwashing and drying) and regular cleaning of commonly touched surfaces.

Schools have been advised by the Ministry of Health that sport is permitted, and this includes contact sport. In situations like these where physical distancing is not possible, extra emphasis on handwashing and drying (or cleansing with hand sanitiser) before and after activities and regular cleaning of equipment will be mandatory. There will also be stringent guidelines around contact tracing.

Taupo-nui-a-Tia under Alert

- We are excited that we will be fully open and operational on 18 May 2020.
- We expect all students to be back at college when we open under Level 2 unless there are health issues. Only those who are unwell in any way should be absent. Please notify the college of an absence through the attendance line (07 376 1100 Ext1).
- Timetables will revert to normal and distance learning will be reduced to digital resources posted online. All zoom support will end on Friday 15 May. Students who are unable to attend due to illness or other legitimate reasons will be follow learning via these digital resources on Google Classroom. This will be our distance learning at Level 2. continued on page 2

Taupo-nui-a-Tia Assurances

- Hygiene requirements will be front and centre both in terms of our messages to our Tauponui-a-Tia College community and in terms of expected practice.
- Contact tracing is in place through period attendance checks, which can be tracked through the Taupo-nui-a-Tia College website.
- Assemblies will not occur initially then be kept to Year Levels to allow physical distancing for the next few weeks.
- PE and sports activities will occur subject to handwashing before and after, cleaning of equipment between activities and contact tracing of all groups.
- Students are encouraged to bring their own drink bottles to avoid sharing drinking fountains.

Important considerations

- School transport services will be running as normal from 18 May. Additional hygiene measures are in place to minimise the risk of transmission.
- The canteen will operate during Level 2. There
 will be some restrictions on the products
 available. We suggest that student bring their
 own food for the first week until we get
 processes in place.
- Visitors: The visitor's register must be signed for contact tracing.
- Any student having received hard copy resources, Ministry devices, College devices or College resources during Alert Level 3 should return them on 18 May. This will ensure all students can continue to benefit from them during Alert Level 2.
- If you have circumstances that have changed since lockdown that may be causing concern regarding your child's education eg financial or family circumstances - please don't hesitate to get in touch.

I look forward to welcoming our students back on Monday 18th May.
