STUDENT WELLBEING

Taupō-nui-a-Tia College is committed to the wellbeing of all students. This focus on wellbeing ties together the curriculum’s vision, principles, values, key competencies, and learning areas. Wellbeing clearly positions learners and their development as confident young people.

Our students feel secure in the knowledge that when they face challenges, the college has very transparent and well established systems in place for managing them. We always encourage a sense of belonging and inclusiveness in our cohesive learning community.

The ways in which we look after our students include:

- ▶ parents and students being welcomed with a powhiri into the Taupō-nui-a-Tia family on day one
- ▶ having pastoral care specialists, our Deans, whose prime objective is to ensure the welfare and academic needs of the students are met. The Deans can be contacted to discuss any aspect of your child’s education
- ▶ whanau teachers who work closely with the students and undertake academic mentoring. These teachers stay with the same group throughout their years at college
- ▶ the friendly office staff, who are always ready to help our students and their families
- ▶ our guidance counsellor, who provides a confidential service for advice and support
- ▶ our careers advisor, who helps students determine their positive future pathways
- ▶ the BayTrust Health Centre, where students can access a nurse, physiotherapist, doctor and other outside agencies. This is also where belongings can be cared for in a secure environment
- ▶ peer mediators, who are trained to support other students
- ▶ Diversity Rainbow Group student led wellbeing committee, who encourage a sense of belonging and wellbeing.

Which career pathway to follow is one of the most important decisions a young person will make. Taupō-nui-a-Tia College offers a high level of careers support and guidance. Our students benefit from a comprehensive service that enables a seamless transition into tertiary study or the workforce.

- ▶ Close association with Taupō Pathways - a community organisation working with youth around employment

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MONITORING FOR SUCCESS

Leaving school with the qualifications and academic results to enable our students to fulfil their future goals is of utmost importance at Taupō-nui-a-Tia College.
