Annual goal 1

Raise literacy and numeracy levels for all students

Target

- 70% pass rate in numeracy, reading, and writing common assessment activities (CAA) for students identified as ready to be assessed i.e. identified as 4A or higher

Annual goal 2

Eliminate the achievement gap between Māori and non-Māori at NCEA levels 1 & 2

Targets

- NCEA level 1: 90% pass rate for Māori and non-Māori
- NCEA level 2: 85% pass rate for Māori and non-Māori
- NCEA level 3: 80% pass rate for Māori and non-Māori
- UE: 60% attainment for Māori and non-Māori

Annual goal 3

Raise the awareness and understanding of the TNT learner profile at a junior and senior level

Targets

- 70% of students attending school 90% or higher
- Junior and senior learner profile outcomes are measured

Literacy and numeracy committee
