


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A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL/TUMUAKI

STUDENT WELLBEING

Taupo-nui-a-Tia College is committed to the wellbeing of all students. We offer a caring, supportive environment for students to learn, always encouraging a sense of belonging and inclusiveness in our cohesive learning community.

- ▶ We have a strong pastoral care team consisting of year level deans, a guidance counselor (MNZAC) and careers advisor. Their prime objective is to ensure the welfare, academic needs and positive future pathways of our students are met
- ▶ Whānau teachers work closely with our students, offering support and academic mentoring. They provide a great point of contact between school and home
- ► The Baytrust Health Centre, where students can access a nurse, physiotherapist, doctor and other outside agencies
- ▶ We endeavor to ensure a 'safe space' physically and mentally for all students. We have a student led and youth service supported Rainbow / Queer group
- Our students are supported in their learning in various ways Our learning support team caters to individual student abilities, learning needs and interests



FUTURE PATHWAYS









SPORTING OPPORTUNITIES

Dance is an important part of many students' lives in Taupō.


Our dance program offers students an opportunity to


A progressive school based on traditional values

- Strong links and regular use of community based professionals and experts






From the moment you walk into Taupo-nui-a-Tia College, you will feel the positive vibe in the place. There is an enviable school spirit and a strong sense of pride.


